# **Sabbatical Coming**

Since the theme of this Omer is sabbatical/reset, this seems like a good time to let the congregation know that I will be on official sabbatical beginning in March of 2023 and ending in late July/early August. My last one was during the same months of 2011, and Karen and I were joined by our sons Micah and Jonah, in elementary school at the time.

The concept of sabbatical comes from the Torah itself, where it is called Shemita. It is intended for the land (which lies fallow that year) and the people who farm it, but it also can involve resolution of debts and loans. It is every seventh year, based on the seven days of creation.

This concept made its way into academia, clergy, and even businesses (Apple was among the first major companies to integrate the concept). In a way it is a reward for longevity, but, even more than that, it offers an opportunity to reflect, rejuvenate, and reset.

This particular sabbatical will be after 12 years instead of 7, but is the right time for me and Karen with our kids both grown and out of the house. As we did last time, we will likely spend most of our time in Jerusalem—studying, doing Ulpan, and taking whatever random classes we might find. We will likely take a few weeks on either end just completely pausing. Last time we went to Fiji, Australia, China, and Dubai. We haven't decided yet what we will do this time, but we are certainly looking forward to it.

The B'nai Mitzvah schedule was made two years ago with my sabbatical in mind, so I won't be missing any of those. There won't be a rabbi replacing me, though there will be rabbis to cover emergencies. Our many talented laypeople will pick up the rest of my duties.

Hopefully, the crescendo will be a congregational trip to Israel in June of 2023, where many of you will meet us over there. We will have an informational meeting about that in April, likely over Zoom.

While I am very much looking forward to this "reset," I am also excited to continue our sacred work together here this year, which, God willing, will be much more in person than in the past two years.



#### **Power of TBA Members**

A lot of things happen regularly in our congregation: religious services on Monday and Thursday mornings, Friday nights, Saturday mornings, and, of course, holidays; Kiddush lunches on Saturdays; the Gan and Bet Sefer with their schedules for classes, breaks, trips, and celebrations; parties for Chanukah, Purim, Simchat Torah, and other holidays; fundraisers; classes and lectures; gatherings with mourners; and much more. But one recurring event, the annual Members' Meeting, is, in many ways, quite different and is, perhaps, a time to reset.



But perhaps most important, the Members' Meeting is when the members exercise their powers. What powers, you may ask? Temple Beth Abraham (our formal name is actually Congregation Beth Abraham of Oakland, California) is a nonprofit corporation organized under the State of California's Nonprofit Religious Corporation Law, "irrevocably dedicated to charitable, religious and educational purposes." Because we are a corporation, we must and do have bylaws, which govern the corporation.

The bylaws provide that the Rabbi, the Cantor or Cantorial Soloist, and the Gabbi are responsible for the Congregation's religious life. The Board of Trustees manages the endowment. And the Board of Directors sets policy and administers "the affairs of the Congregation" consistent with the bylaws and Robert's Rules of Order.

But everything starts with the members, who have many powers, exercised in large part at the annual Members' Meeting.

One power is that the members elect the officers of the congregation (the President, four Vice Presidents, the Treasurer, and, if the bylaws are amended this year, the Secretary). Another is that the members elect a portion of the directors on the Board of Directors each year (we try to stagger the terms) and, most years, some of the 11 trustees on the Board of Trustees. Still another power is that the members receive a report on and approve the Congregation's budget for the next fiscal year (ours begins on July 1). Yet another is that the members approve changes to the bylaws (and I am afraid that there is yet another possible bylaws revision on the agenda for your approval this year – to provide that the members, rather than the board, will elect our Secretary). Finally, and most important, on the infrequent occasions when the Congregation hires a new Rabbi or Cantor, the members must approve the choice in a secret ballot. (Fortunately, Rabbi Bloom has many years to run on his contract!)

The Members' Meeting also is an opportunity to meet with members of the Board of Directors and the Board of Trustees, to talk about the Congregation, and to share ideas and aspirations. Please join us on May 22.

# What 'Reset' Means at Gan

The word, reset, is part of our everyday shared language at Gan. It is one of the ways that we show kindness to each other in our classroom environment as well as outside in our yard. It is also how we treat our materials and environments with respect. What does it mean? It means to return the space back to the way it was when you found it. The children learn as early as in Kitah Alef, what it means to reset the materials in a space. Rather than use the words 'clean up', which implies that everything should be put away and will no longer be used for the time being. When we use the word 'reset', it implies that someone will be engaging with the materials in the space after you leave. Just as the space was set up in an inviting way for you to explore, the kind thing to do is to reset the space before moving on to the next activity. When a child resets a space, they are thinking outside of themselves and acting with kindness for the other members of their kehillah – community. Taking the time to pause their movement from one activity to another to focus on arranging the materials in an inviting manner for a friend to find also allows the children to practice intentionality. At the very core, to reset is a mindfulness practice. As adults we find ourselves just as busy as the children, moving from one thing to another without time in between to pause. The next time you are running around your home tidying up, remember to pause and reframe your thinking to reset the space rather than clean it up. It may feel like less of a chore and more like an artful act of arranging the space to feel inviting.

# Second Passover Matzo Casserole with Greens and Lemon-Egg Sauce

Be sure to save some matzo to celebrate the Jewish calendar's "second" Passover, Pesach Sheni.

Pesach Sheni, observed on the 14th of Iyer, was created a year after Exodus as a make-up holiday for those who could not participate in the Passover sacrifice. This second Passover is one month after the day prescribed for bringing the Pesach offer-

ing to the Temple. It has become symbolic of redemption and the power of second chances in life and Judaism through the agency of teshuvah (return and repentance).

This year Pesach Sheni is May 14th through nightfall May 15th. It is customary to eat matzo during the holiday and some Jewish communities conduct a service similar to the Seder used during Passover. Since the destruction of the Temple, there are really no prohibitions of what to eat on Pesach Sheni and it is permissible to own chametz (leavened food). In the days of the Temple, chametz could not be eaten with the Pesach Sheni sacrificial lamb.

In the spirit of the Second Passover, here is one of my favorite matzo-based dishes – a vegetarian mina (kind of a matzo lasagna or layered casserole) with greens and a lemon-egg sauce. The recipe was inspired by Sephardic and Greek-Jewish dishes.



#### Serves 2-3 as a main dish or 4-6 as a side dish

1/4 cup olive oil, divided, plus extra for pan

2 cups chopped onions

2 cups chopped leeks, white and light green parts

3 Tbs. finely chopped garlic, divided

3 tsp. paprika, divided

1/4 tsp. ground black pepper, divided

1/2 tsp. salt, divided

1 Tbs. plus 2 Tbs. minced fresh fennel fronds (leaves) or parsley

2 cups chopped fennel bulb

1 tsp. plus 2 Tbs. minced grated lemon zest

8 cups chopped Swiss chard

4 cups chopped dandelion or other bitter greens (see notes)

1/4 tsp. sugar or as needed

Lemon-Egg Sauce (see recipe below)

1/2 cup warm vegetable stock or water

3 sheets plain matzo

Heat half the oil in 12" sauté pan over medium high heat. Sauté onions and leeks until softened. Add 1 Tbs. garlic, sauté until golden. Stir in 1 tsp, paprika, half the pepper and salt, 1 Tbs. fennel fronds and 1 tsp. lemon zest. Add chopped fennel. Sauté until fennel is tender. Remove to large bowl. Do not wash pan.

Add 2 Tbs. oil to pan, Sauté 1 tsp. garlic until golden. Stir in 1 tsp. paprika and remaining salt and pepper. Add chard and dandelion greens. Sauté until wilted. Taste. If bitter, stir in sugar, adding more as needed. Combine greens with fennel. Taste. Adjust seasonings.



Make Lemon-Egg Sauce (below). Heat oven to 350 degrees. Oil 8-inch by 8-inch baking dish. Place heated stock in rimmed dish large enough to fit matzo. Quickly dip both sides of one matzo so the sheet begins to soften. Place flat in baking dish. Top with half of the vegetables. Spoon a quarter of the lemon sauce over vegetables. Dip a second sheet of matzo in stock, place on top. Spread remaining vegetables on top, spoon another fourth of sauce on top.

Dip remaining matzo. Place on top. Cover with another fourth of sauce, sprinkle with remaining paprika. Lightly cover with foil. Bake 25 minutes, remove foil and bake about 20 minutes until sauce is bubbly and top matzo crisped. Serve hot, warm or room temperature. Just before serving, drizzle with remaining sauce (reheated if necessary) and sprinkle with remaining garlic, fennel fronds and lemon zest.

Lemon-Egg Sauce: Stir together until well combined (or process until smooth in blender) 4 large, beaten eggs, 1 tsp. lemon zest, 1 1/2 cups fresh lemon juice, 2 Tbs. matzo cake meal and 1/4 tsp. salt. Place in pot and whisk in 2 cups room temperature vegetable stock or water. Simmer over low to medium low heat (do not boil), whisking almost constantly until reduced by half. Taste. Add salt if needed. Strain to remove any bits of cooked egg.

Note: If desired, replace bitter greens with additional chard.
